Food Scales Help You Control Portions, Slim Down

For many, summer is a wake-up call for shedding unwanted pounds. And buying a food scale is a smart first step.

Portion Education. It's easy to underestimate portion sizes, but a food scale reveals the undeniable truth about how much food

you're really putting on your plate. It also helps you visualize. "Even doing it just once or twice can be helpful," says Lisa Young, Ph.D., R.D., author of The Portion Teller Plan: The No-Diet Reality Guide to Eating, Cheating and Losing Weight Permanently (Morgan Road Books, 2006).

Learning how to eyeball portion sizes accurately is an important skill, since it's not always practical to weigh your food.

Weighing Pros and Cons. Food scales have come a long way from traditional dial-based (analog) models. New digital scales are more precise and can weigh foods in 1/2-ounce or 1/2-ounce increments.

To narrow your choices, first decide the type of scale you want: 1) a digital scale that only weighs food, 2) a digital scale that also gives nutrition information or 3) a less expensive analog scale.

Scales that provide nutrition information may satisfy a curiosity about what's in your food—assuming it's in the database—but these scales are cumbersome to use. Some let you view only one nutrient at a time. Others can calculate and simultaneously display many nutrients.

Some scales keep track of your day's intake, but keep in mind that it's time-consuming to input everything you eat.

EN's Bottom Line. A scale that simply weighs and measures food is really all you need. But before you buy, consider:

- What is maximum weighing capacity?
- What increments are used for weight?
- Is there an "add-and-weigh" feature to allow you to to weigh many items in the same container sequentially?
- How many and what type of batteries?

For nutrition data models, find out:

- How many foods are in the database?
- Which nutrients are provided?
- How do you enter a food item—by looking up the code in a manual or by scrolling through a list of possibilities?
- How many nutrients are displayed at one time?
